Interventions with Families to Promote Healthy Internet Use

Do you know what your kids are really doing online? This is an interactive, experiential workshop for mental health professionals, educators, and parents who are seeking a better understanding of how to promote a healthier use of the Internet. You learn psychological and behavioral criteria to help adults and children determine the difference between healthy Internet use, misuse, potential for abuse, and addiction and how to establish age-appropriate goals to maintain healthy use.

The workshop provides counselors and educators with behavioral tools and interactive exercises to use with students and their families.
